The Kingston Tennis Club opened its doors in 1924 and is one of the oldest sports organizations in Kingston. It is a non-profit club located downtown in a quiet, tree-lined neighbourhood. The historic wooden clubhouse contains change rooms, a casual lounge area, and the steward's office where court bookings can be made and tennis supplies, drinks and snacks can be purchased.

There are seven outdoor courts available for booking

either in person, over the phone, or by using our convenient online system.

We welcome members of all ages and all levels of ability, from beginner to advanced. It is a familyoriented club that provides many opportunities for young players to participate, from summer day camps to weekend skill-building sessions and youth tournaments.

We host Singles, Doubles, and Mixed Doubles tournaments for competitive play and also run weekly drop-in



Mixed Doubles games for social interaction. Our Mixed Singles ladder provides an opportunity to meet new people who play at your own skill level.

We also host a Tennis Social once a month, consisting



of three rounds of Mixed Doubles followed by a themed meal and camaraderie on the clubhouse deck. All players are welcome!



Finances

Over the past several years, the club has steadily made improvements in the facilities while simultaneously making significant strides to whittle down the balance on the outstanding debentures; so much so that we anticipate being able to pay off the remaining balance by the end of September 2013, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

As we begin to turn the final page on this chapter, we are able to look ahead to further, major improvements at the club: updating and rationalizing the layout of our facilities to enhance enjoyment of the club and to better control access to the facilities. This involves plans to build a new clubhouse on the lawn area and adding an eighth court in the existing clubhouse location in order to support our growing membership. We hope to begin that chapter as early as the Fall of 2014.

President's Message



The days of the seemingly endless, albeit mild, winter are almost over and we all hope that soon we will be at the KTC courts to enjoy our beloved game of tennis. From last November until now, your volunteer executive has been working hard to ensure that the upcoming 89th KTC season runs in a highlyorganized fashion and provides exciting athletic and social events for club members and their guests. There is so much to look forward to:

the ever-popular Mixed Doubles Leagues and Drop-in Doubles, the Mixed Singles Ladder (to be re-invigorated due to a new format!), the KTC Men's and Women's Tournaments, and the (delicious!) monthly evening Socials are some of the events, just to name a few.

I am happy to report that this season we will have two very capable tennis professionals who will offer a full range of individual and group lessons, as well as clinics for adults and juniors: Jennifer Williams will assume the responsibilities of KTC Head Pro, and Michael Stych will be our new Assistant Pro and Junior Camp Director.

The club will enter the upcoming season on a good financial footing, which will allow us to keep the membership rates largely unchanged. However, we have several infrastructure projects, which have been scheduled to take place before the club open-

ing or in early May, depending on the weather. This includes the repair of the water line under Court 7, repairs to the light fixtures damaged by high winds at Court 4, and court surface repairs/painting (Courts 1 and 7). In addition, we have begun the initial planning to erect a new KTC clubhouse.

As can be seen from all of the above, the management and improvement of the club's facilities will require not only substantial funds, but the full commitment of KTC executive board and staff and, frankly, all the help we can get from you, the KTC members.

To start with, come on out for the Spring Clean-up Day (set for Saturday, April 14th, rain date - April 21st) to get ready for the club opening on April 28th. Shrug off the winter blahs and get your tennis gear in order. Looking forward to seeing you on the courts!

Queen's Tennis

Tennis at Queen's University has not been a varsity (funded) sport for several years now. Queen's tennis players take it upon themselves to form a competitive team and join the KTC as Fall members, practising at the club during designated times.

The Queen's Tennis Team played in the OUA Team Championship in mid-November. New Junior Camp times approved

Several current members highlighted legitimate concerns regarding the "squeeze" on morning court availability when the summer camps start. In response to these concerns, the executive proposed revamping the Junior Camp structure as follows: camps will begin at 9:30am rather than 9:00am (before and after-camp supervision will be offered for an extra charge). Thus ALL courts (apart from possible private lessons) will be available to members until

9:30am. In addition, the camps will reduce their court usage from 9:30am to 11:30am, making two additional courts available to members. As before, during the summer camps only one court can be booked by the Club Pro(s) to provide lessons to regular members and guests. The suggested changes will significantly improve the availability of courts for regular members during morning hours, while preserving all teaching aspects of Junior Camps.

Infrastructure Update

Plans are in the works this spring to replace the water supply pipe that has been slowly leaking in the vicinity of Court 7 this past season. The leak is somewhere underground between the main connection at the road and the hookup to the clubhouse, but has proven elusive to find. The simplest and most economical solution is to sever the old pipe and install a new one using a horizontal drilling method. A hole for the new pipe will be tunnelled underneath Court 7, leaving the surface undisturbed and avoiding additional costs.

KASSAA and EOSSAA at the KTC

Each spring the KTC offers its courts for a reasonable fee to host the Kingston and Eastern Ontario secondary school tournaments. The organisers of these events (KTC members Brian Bontekoe, David Stocks and Dan Fruhling) approached the club with the request to use all the courts

for one full day during each of these events. Attendees at the 2011 AGM supported the request and voted unanimously in favour of the request. This season the KTC will be closed twice for one full day: one day for KASSAA and one day for EOSSAA.


