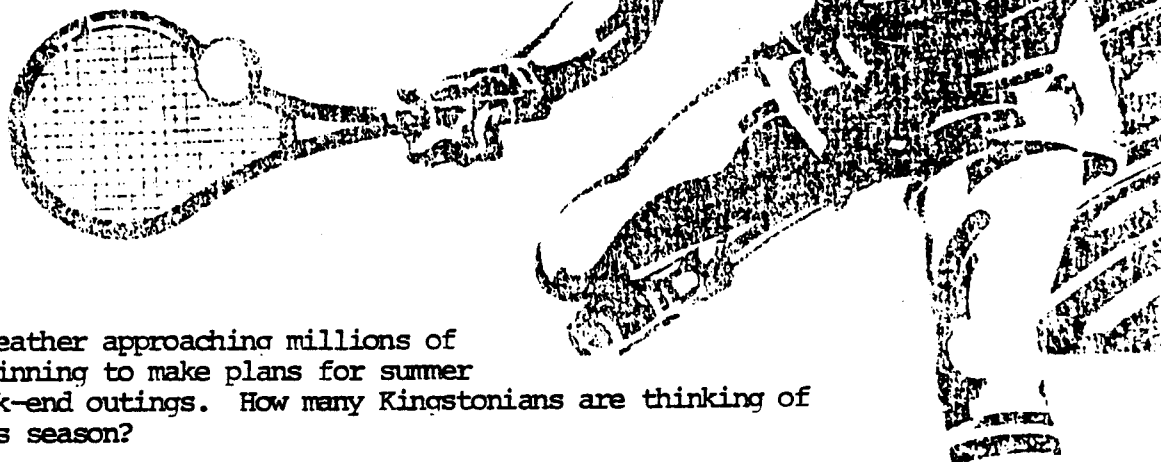

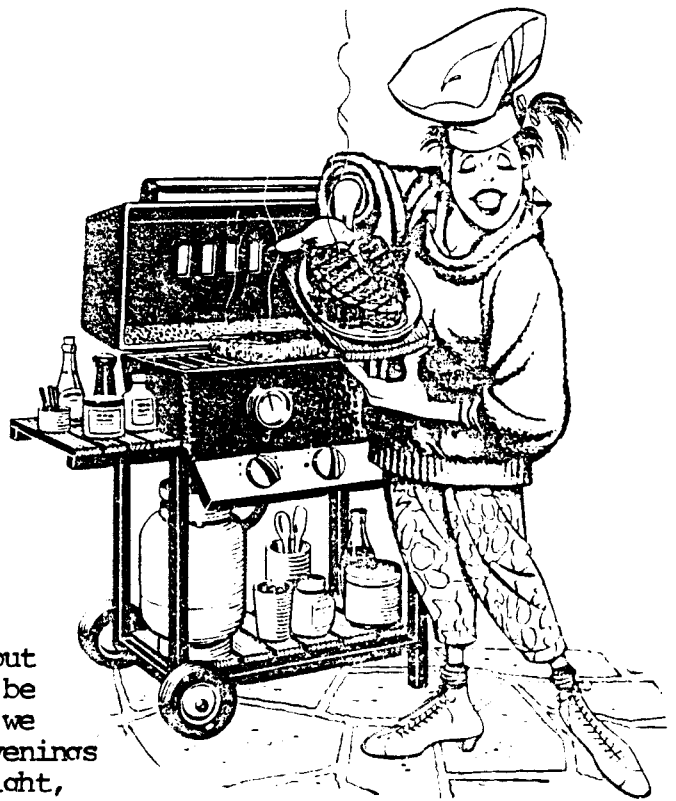

Tennis is a conservative and dignified sport. The etiquette of both gallery and court conforms to the spirit of the game.

Good manners are never out of place; they will help you to meet and keep many tennis friends.

TWELVE UNWRITTEN RULES OF GOOD COURTMANSHIP

Attitude

Before you play, greet your opponent in a friendly manner and introduce yourself. Rally to warm up and then ask if your opponent wishes to take practice services before the start of the game. This also ensures that the rules of the game are observed.

Knowledge of the Rules

Learn the rules of the game. This speeds up the game and allows more time for concentration on improving your game.

Dress the Part

Look clean and tidy on court. Appropriate clothing is a part of etiquette - men should always wear their shirts - swimming trunks are for the beach or pool.

Meet Your Match

Whatever your standard, any tennis is better than no tennis at all. A good player should play with a lesser player occasionally, but it is out of line for a beginner to try to set up a game with a Club champion.

Avoid Stalling

Because fast tennis is more fun to play, it is considered bad to stop for a breather during a match. You should be in position to receive each serve as soon as possible. The receiver should retrieve the balls on his side of the net so the server has two or three in hand to start each serve.

Calling Serves

It is the receiver's place to call the close serves in or out. In case of doubt it is good tennis manners to give your opponent the benefit of the call. Strictly speaking, the receiver should not touch any serve that is not good, but it helps players on an adjacent court if the balls are stopped from going on their court and just rolled to the net. The server should call the score after each point. During the rally, you are the linesman - do not call the good balls, just the outs. Offer to replay the point if there is interference by a ball rolling on your court from an adjacent one.

Replay of Fast Serves

Make sure the receiver is ready and offer to replay if doubt exists. When receiving, do not return the ball unless the serve was good and you intended to play the point.

Crossing Courts

When one of your balls wanders over on to another court, never attempt to retrieve it during play. Wait till the point is completed and retrieve the ball quickly. Return the balls from other courts in the first break in your own play.

Tennis Etiquette



Court Time

It is thoughtless and selfish to hog the court when others are waiting unless you have booked the court for a specific time. Vacate the court quickly after one set or at the specified time.

Treatment of Umpires and Linesmen

Don't argue. In every match you and your opponents will probably believe that one or more bad decisions have been made, but as a general rule the linesman is in a better position than you are to make close decisions. When you get a bad call, do not throw your racquet, swear, hit the ball sky-high, etc. Accept the decision in a sportsmanlike manner.

Control your Temper

Lose your temper and you will lose your concentration and quite often the match. Keep your concentration on the game and keep on fighting till the last point has been played. Self-control is one of the most important attributes of sportsmanship and successful play. Shake hands with your opponent and thank him/her for the match.

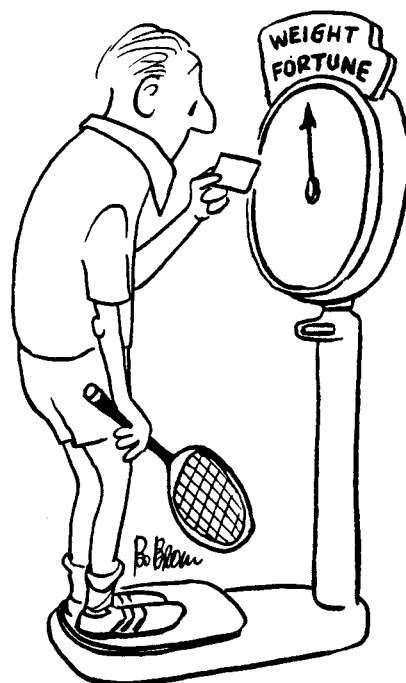
Side-line Etiquette

Loud conversations, bouncing balls etc. will distract players on court and lose you some tennis friends. Never walk behind another court while play is in progress. Wait for a break in play before proceeding to your court.

CAN I SERVE OUTSIDE THE SINGLES LINE IN DOUBLES ?

Not too long ago, the commentator of a televised doubles match said one of the players was serving illegally. The player was serving from outside the singles sideline.

It seems improbable that the TV commentator did not know the rule governing the allowable position of the server in doubles. The server in doubles may stand anywhere behind the baseline between the centre mark and the doubles sideline extension. In singles, the server may not stand outside the singles sideline.

Memberships and Fee Schedule

The bad news is that fees are going up an average of 13% this year but the good news is that it is still a good buy for your dollar. Economics, wages, proposed expenditures, etc. all play a part in our need for the increase.

The fee schedule for the 1988 season is:

Family Membership	\$260 (includes 2 adults/2 juniors - additional juniors \$40 each)	
Husband and Wife	\$200	200
Adult	\$130	75
Junior	\$ 75 (under age 18 as of January 1, 1988)	225 130 75

Members are permitted to bring guests. There is a guest fee of \$5.00 a day for each guest and while there is no limit on the number of times an out-of-town guest may play at the club, there is a limit of three visits for people residing in Kingston.

Guests who wish to join the club will have their membership fee reduced by the amount paid as guest fees.

Court bookings - JUST A REMINDER.

1. Courts are booked for one hour periods on the 1/2 hour ie: 5:30 - 6:30.
2. Members may book in person three days in advance.
3. Phone bookings as follows: 12 noon - 1 P.M. two days in advance
8 P.M. - 10:30 P.M. three days in advance.
4. Juniors' play on reserved courts is limited to 5:30. Juniors may play with an adult member until 6:30 or whenever courts are otherwise unused.
