SPRING NEUSLETTER 1991

Once again this year our early membership drive has been a distinct success. We already have 280 members — and counting. (To put this in perspective, this is as many members as we had at the end of the season two years ago.) In fact, if we continue at this rate, the possibility arises of having to cut off the membership for the first time in years. (Capacity for our seven—court club is about 550 members.)

For those who have joined, thank you. Shoe tags may be picked up at the club after opening, April 27th. For those haven't, there's no time like the present. An application form is enclosed. (Our mailing system, while a model of high-tech sophistication (five people around a table) isn't quite sophisticated enough to separate those who have joined from those who haven't, so if you've already joined and receive an unneeded membership form, please accept our apologies and pass it along to a friend.)

A new flyer outlining many of our club programs is enclosed. It includes a free guest pass, so please use it to introduce a friend or friends to the club. We have had several thousand of these printed, and once the club is open will be looking for volunteers to distribute them in neighborhoods, schools, places of work, etc. If you're willing to help, please let us know.

We extend a particular welcome to the many new members who have joined. We're glad to have you, and hope you enjoy the club. You're encouraged to check with our friendly and helpful stewards early in the season for information on our various leagues, group lessons and so on, which may be of interest, and will help you to meet people and find playing partners. In particular we draw your attention to --

- ** FIRST SOCIAL -- Friday, May 17th. Mixed doubles, food and refreshments, enthusiastically organized by Jacqueline Martel and Danielle Charbonneau. Everyone welcome, no partner or backhand required.
- ** JUNIOR TENNIS CAMP -- A great deal of interest has been expressed in this program, which was so successful last summer. Final details are still being worked out, but we can confirm that an extended, improved and reasonably-priced version of the camp will run under the direction of every five-year-old's favorite instructor, Bill Parker, starting the week of July 2. Further information and sign-up sheets will be available shortly after the club opens. And be warned, this program is expected to fill up quickly.

If demand warrants, we may also run a special <u>three-day mini-camp from June 26 to 28.</u> immediately after school is out. Parents or children in-terested in this should let Bill or the stewards know as early as possible.

Bill is also exploring the possibility of forming and coaching a competitive $\underline{K.T.C.}$ Junior Team for interclub and tournament play. Watch for further information.





GATORADE/WILSON TENNIS FAIR


